

Instructions for Completing Your Artist Biography

Your text is limited to one page.

When you have completed this form, please print it and submit it with your work.

An artist's bio is a short paragraph, written in prose not point-form and in the third person. For example, using the pronouns he, she, or they. An artist's bio talks about the way your life has influenced your work. A bio is about you, the artist, as opposed to an "artist's statement" which is more about the work and the themes behind it. To be included by artist:

- The materials and techniques you use. For example, She weaves mainly in fine cottons and prefers to use Summer and Winter drafts on 8 shafts.
- Fibre- related education including workshops.
- Awards; include any ribbons from the Saanich Fair or from conferences.
- Significant projects you are working on, upcoming exhibitions/sales, and collaborations.
- Where you are from, where you live and work.
- You may attach a photo to your bio if you wish.
